B. F. Jones.

Ben F. Jones, candidate for Circuit Judge of this district, came to Lincoln county 44 years ago and continuously resided here until three years ago when he moved to Independence. When the county of Lincoln was created by cutting off the western portion of Benton county Mr. Jones was appointed county clerk, he was elected to that office at the two preceding terms. While in the clerk's office he studied law and was admitted to the bar in 1897, and has since been actively engaged in that profession. He has represented Lincoln and Polk counties in the legislature for three terms from 1903 to 1909, and as representative did much good for the counties he represented and the state. For the past year he has held the position as Register of the United States land office at Roseburg, lately resigning that position to accept the nomination for Circuit Judge. There is no better Republican nor a man better qualified for the office in the state than is Ben F. Jones, and as his opponent is a Democrat, he will receive a big vote in Lincoln county.

In the contest for Circuit Judge of this district there are four candidates, two of whom are to be elected. The law says one Judge must reside in Curry or Coos county and the other in Douglas, Lane, Benton, Linn or Lincoln county. Judge Coke and Upton are the Coos county candidates, and B. F. Jones and J. W. Hamilton are the other candidates, both residing in Douglas county. Our voters should bear this in mind and vote for one of the two in the different counties.

Vote No on Annexation.

The portion of Washington county proposed to be annexed to Multnomah is seven miles wide, contains 112 of our 730 sections, four and a half of our fifteen millions of taxable property, one-fourth of our voters and population and one-half of our railroad mileage. 500 voters of this strip have signed a remonstrance against annexation—a clear majority, as less than 300 signed the petition and about 900 votes were cast at the last general election. In addition many who first favored annexation now oppose it and say the cut was made too deep. We ask you to vote No on Washington-Multnomah division.—W. D.
