The following figures taken by Assessor W. E. Ball shows the wonderful increase in this county, in acreage and valuations since the year 1902:

In the nine years an actual increase in acres of land has been 190,174 acres or 97.21 per cent, while the assessed value has increased 12.80 times or 1,280 per cent.

The increase in value of all other properties whatsoever kind and all property except acreage has been 554 per cent, or by 5.54 times.

The net increase in assessed valuations on all property in the county has been 881 per cent or 8.81 times from 1902 to 1910 inclusive.

The increase in money raised by all general levies is 143 per cent, or from \$21,649.24 in the year 1902 to \$50,571.98 in 1909.

The increase of money raised by all special levies has been 449 per cent, or from \$7,744.13 in 1902 to \$42,490.41 in 1909.

The net increase of the amount of property actually handled is about 110 per cent from 1902 to 1909.

The increase of recording of instruments from the year 1905 up to and including the first 11 months of 1910 show an increase as follows:

The net increase, allowing for the twelfth month in 1910 at the same rate as the 11 preceding months accounted for above, will be 121 per cent.

Here's hoping for many more such parties.
