ROCK TRAIN O. K.

Last Tuesday the traction engine and cars for hauling rock for the construction of the rock road between Toledo and Siletz were tested out and pronounced to be efficient. The County Court who purchased this machinery are well pleased with the result of the tryout. The train consists of a large traction engine and three cars built especially for hauling rock. Twenty yards of rock will be hauled at each load, and as the tires of both engine and cars are very wide the heavy loads running over the road will have a good effect in packing the roads.
