NOTICE OF SPECIAL ELECTION IN THE CITY OF TOLEDO.

To the Legal Voters of the City of Toledo:

Notice is hereby given that on Monday, the 31st day of July, A. D. 1911, a special election of the legal voters of the City of Toledo will be held commencing at 8 o'clock in the forenoon of said day, and continuing until 7 o'clock in the afternoon of said day. The polling place at which said election will be held is in the Council Chamber in the City Hall in said city.

At said election there will be submitted to the legal voters of said city for their approval or rejection an act supplementary to the charter of said city, the ballot title of which is as follows:

REFERRED TO THE PEOPLE BY THE COMMON COUNCIL AN ACT

empowering the City of Toledo to purchase the waterworks of The Toledo Water and Electric Light Company at the price of Six Thousand Dollars and to issue bonds in payment thereof, to extend, improve and operate said waterworks and to exercise the right of eminent domain therein; re-enacting the charter amendment approved by the voters of said city at the election held therein October tenth, 1910, authorizing said city to acquire and operate its municipal waterworks and issue bonds therefor; and ratifying all acts done under authority thereof.

Shall the above Act be adopted? Vote Yes or No.

C. C. McBride of Eddyville was appointed Justice of the Peace for Little Elk precinct upon his entering into bonds and taking oath of office as by law required.

J. S. Bones granted privilege of erecting a warehouse on wagon road on Siletz river near Pikes camp. The building not to interfere with public travel.

J. H. Sugg was authorized to replace any defective plank on the Butler bridge; and to put the wagon road from Toledo to Bay View in passable condition.

O. E. McMillan was authorized to purchase necessary bridge irons and nails to be charged to expense of Lincoln county, for construction of bridge over McMillan creek, the balance of material and labor to be furnished by the people interested.
