SNAKES 25c A POUND
MEXICAN MAKES A LIVING BY
SNARING RATTLERS.
Hunter Catches Venomous Reptlles
Alive and Finds a Market Here
and Abroad-Uses a
Forked Stick.

San Antonlo, Tex.-Hunting snakes cor a living may not be an occupation
that is really pleasant in all its phases and ot may not be attractive
po all classes of men. Howeve to all claises of men. However,
there is one man in this cty, a Mex-
ican, who has mate site there is one man in this city, a Mex-
ican, who has made snake bunting a
bustness tor a number of years. He bustness for a number of years. He
does not conflne himself to the harm less variety, but makes a spectalty of
catchang the cotton mouth moccasin
and the rattlesnake. These are caught allve and sold to a dealer in
snakes.
Thls Mextcan snake Thls Mexican snake hunter has two
methods of catching a rattler. If the
snake is large he placed a forked stick on its back and holds it down
until he can get hold of it in such a manner as to drop it into a sack
But if it is a small rattler a stick is
not used. The hunter watches the
noptile until it coils rise reptlie until it coils ready to strike
and then with a swift movement of the thand catches swe mnake just be-
low the head, grips it tightly and slips it into a sack.
While catching water moccasins.
however he however, he usually goes barefoot
and when the moccasin Is too large
to be caught with the hand it is las. soed with a small lariat attached to done by letting the reptile swim
through the loop. At other times it is thrown over the head of the swim-
ming snake with as much accuracy as a skilled marksman shoots with a
gun.
In the winter, when snakes are hibernating, the snake hunter finds The and thrusts a stick down it
The sits down to watch. If the
stick moves he knows there is some thing below and proceeds at once to
dig out the snake. dig out the snake. But if there is no
movement after watching for a half
hour or so, the bunter seeks another hole and repeats the test with a stick.
