County Clerk R. H. Howell again asks the Republican voters for the nomination for County Clerk at the coming primary nominating election. Mr. Howell is just completing his first term as Lincoln county's Clerk. He has given the county most excellent service. During his term he has been most earnest in the performance of his duties, has always been courteous and obliging, and at the same time has conducted the office in a thorough business manner. During the past two years, since assuming charge of this most important office, the people have been satisfied knowing that the office has been in charge of a man who is thoroughly competent. Mr. Howell is worthy of the endorsement of the Republican voters at the primary on April 19th.

The announcement of William F. Wakefield of Eddyville appears in this issue. Mr. Wakefield asks the Republican voters for the nomination of County Commissioner at the coming nominating election on April 19th. We know of no man in the county more fitted for the position of Commissioner than Mr. Wakefield. He is a young man, is earnest, honest, progressive, and has made a success of his own business—that of farming. He has been a resident of Lincoln county since early boyhood, and has always been interested in and has taken an active part in all affairs of the county and of his community. He is at present road supervisor of his road district and is also a member of the county board of education. Setting aside February 22 as Colonist Day for 1912 Governor West, in his proclamation, calls special attention to the sort of colonists Oregon needs. The Governor says the state does not need city men subsisting on a daily wage, except as he may follow the institution of the factory, the workshop or the business house. The need of the state is active men with active money and efficient effort. The colonist period this year is from March 1 to April 15. The success of the colonist day last year was most unexpected. Nearly every commercial organization in the state participated in this most unique advertising campaign and set aside its own special day for observing it. The total number of pieces of mail that went East because of the special efforts made ran up into the millions. The school children and many social organizations volunteered their services in writing letters and mailing literature. The result was probably the biggest short-time advertising campaign that any state has known.
