And still Toledo's winning streak is here—here's hoping that it stays another week, until after the game with Albany.

Siletz came over Sunday full of confidence as undisputed champions of the county, but the Toledo boys had not been idle and put up a different game from what they did the last time Siletz was here. Fuller started the thing off by fanning out the first six Siletz batters, and during the game fanned a total of 15 batters. Siletz made her tallies, five in the third inning, two in the seventh and two in the ninth. Toledo's were made, one in the first, three in the second, one in the fourth, eight in the fifth and one in the sixth. Casey retired during the fifth inning in favor of Houser, but Houser was unable to stop the landslide until a total of eight runs had piled up during that inning. Houser struck out five batters during his reign on the mound and gave four batters free passes to first. Fuller also allowed four passes on balls. Struck by pitched balls, Fuller 2, Casey 3.
