Lincoln County Fire Patrol Assn.

In response to an invitation issued by State Forester F. A. Elliott a number of timber owners and representatives met at the courthouse in this city at 10 a. m. last Friday to discuss the advisability of organizing a fire patrol association.

The meeting was called to order by Mr. Elliott and upon motion he was elected temporary chairman.

The following board of directors was elected: A. W. Morgan and W. E. Ball, of Toledo; W. R. Hall, of Siletz; Lewis Montgomerie, of Portland; and W. V. Fuller, of Delmas.

The board elected A. W. Morgan, president; Lewis Montgomerie, vice president; W. E. Ball, secretary and treasurer.

The board retained Ted McElvinn of Toledo as supervising warden.

Membership to the Association can be secured by written or personal application to the secretary.

The law as enacted by the Legislature makes it obligatory upon the owner of any timber or brush land to furnish an adequate fire patrol to protect this property.

Inasmuch as the major part of the resources of Lincoln county is embraced in our timber it is wise to protect same and not let it be destroyed through carelessness or negligence on our part.
