Toledo, Or., Oct 8th, 1913
Editor Leader:—In your issue of October 3d your Waldport correspondent writes that there is considerable controversy between the City of Waldport and the County Court, over the condition of the roads leading into Waldport, from the beach and from the south.

There is no controversy between Waldport and the County Court over the condition of roads leading into Waldport from the beach, from the south, or from anywhere else; but there is a difference of opinion between the mayor of Waldport and the County Court as to the expenditure of county road funds within the corporate limits of the City of Waldport.

The same difference of opinion existed between the Deputy District Attorney, at the time the question was submitted to him, and the mayor of Waldport, as exists between the mayor of Waldport and the County Court
