BIDS WANTED.

Bids for building a school house in District No. 50 will be received by the Clerk of that district until 1 o'clock p. m. July 1st 1914. Following are the specifications:

Building to be 22 ft. by 30; 12 feet studding placed 2 ft. center; floor joist and ceiling joist to be 2 foot center; three sills to be placed on blocks not more than 5 ft. apart; blocks to be not less than 12 inches in diameter; sills must be at least 18 inches above the ground; studding to be doubled at corners; plates to be 2 inches by 4 doubled; roof to be hip cut on 9 and 11 pitch or nine foot rise; rafters to be placed 2 ft. center; sheathing to be placed 4 inches apart; shingles to be laid 4 1/2 inches to the weather; there must be at least 2 nails in each shingle. Cornish to be plumb cornish, 16 inches wide; roof hips will be covered with tin hip shingles. There will be a partition 6 ft. from front of building. Outside of building to be covered with 6 in. rustic. The walls and ceiling to be covered with six inch shiplap. All inside of building to have wainscoting not less than four feet high. One front door to swing out; two swing doors from entry to schoolroom to be placed in proper position to conform with schoolroom. Eleven windows, two in front, five on side and four in rear of building; side fasteners on each window. One brick flue 12x16 inches to extend not less than four ft. below the ceiling and not less than four ft. above the roof; the chimney to be placed in corner of building as near as hip of roof will permit. One porch in front, ten feet long, six ft. wide, 8 ft. posts; roof, hip to conform with the main building; four steps, more or less, 12 in. wide, 8 inches full length of porch. Two toilets, four ft. long by six ft., 7 ft. studding, hip roof; rustic outside, ceiling inside; four in. flooring, seat, ventilation, etc.

All work to be done in first-class workman-like manner, under the direction of the School Board. All necessary materials will be furnished by the district.
