The Toledo sawmill has been cutting about 10,000 feet per day while running.

George Sylvester the Newport dispenser of justice was in the city Tuesday.

Krogstad Bros. have been cutting lumber and filling up their yard and shed. They are getting a good stock of finished lumber in the sheds and will rustle for a market for their lumber.

The election of McKinley has so stimulated Clark Copeland that he shipped his wool the first of the week on the strength of it. His total clip amounted to about a hundred pounds.

The subscription for the St. John's church bell, Toledo, has so far progressed that Rev. Chas Booth has sent in the order and hopes to have it in place before New Years. It is to come from the celebrated Meneely Bell Co. of Troy, New York.

Newport lodge No. 89 I. O. O. F. will erect a two story lodge building at Newport. The building will be erected on the water front at Fredericksburg and when completed will be one of the best lodge rooms in this part of the state. "SALMONING" OF DOGS

As this is the season of the year when dogs are most liable to get "salmoned" we again publish for the benefit of our readers, who own dogs, a partial report of Prof. Enlie F. Pernot, bacteriologist of the Oregon State Board of Health, issued in pamphlet form by the Board:

Symptoms

The first noticeable symptoms of the disease occurs invariably nine days after the fish has been eaten. The dog becomes morose, desires to lie down, and refuses to take food.

If the temperature is taken previous to appearance of first symptom it will be found to rise from normal, 101-102 F., to 105.3 on the seventh day, gradually decreasing from the 8th day to subnormal, where it remains slightly fluctuating until death, but never rising to the normal again.

During the course of low temperature the dog appears to be cold and curls up as if it were suffering with abdominal pains. No food is taken after the first symptoms appear, but there is a constant desire to drink, which if allowed is followed by vomiting.

Bowel actions varies; in some cases constipation precedes diarrhoea, while in others diarrhoea begins early, continuing throughout the illness.

From the earliest stages of the disease, emaciation gradually increases until death. The abdomen is tensely constricted and the animal walks with great difficulty.

The mucous membranes, such as lips and eyelids, become bloodless and anemic. In some instances rose spots appear upon the abdomen and inside the legs, being quite noticeable on white-haired dogs.

A dog that has been well salmoned and recovered from the disease, is immunized against subsequent attacks. This has been confirmed by many owners of dogs, that if a salmoned dog recovers from a severe attack of the disease, it never occurs again.

Cure

Dose, two grains of calomel, two days in succession, with a little water to drink.

The most effective time for administering the calomel is about the third day after the first symptoms have been observed, or after the dog has appeared very sick and vomiting.

Our experience has been that if the calomel is given in the last stages of the disease it causes intense suffering owing to the highly inflamed condition of the intestines, and the dog being in such a weak, emaciated condition usually dies from exhaustion in a short time.
