**PARCEL POST RULINGS ARE CHANGED**

Three important changes in parcel post regulations went into effect September 1. One of these makes it possible to get a receipt for parcels, another reduces the cost of insuring certain parcels and also extends the range of the insurance, and the third raises the postage on parcels sent to a number of Oregon and Washington offices which are in the second zone, but will be placed in the third zone as far as charges are concerned, on account of the long distances parcels must travel to reach them.

The receipt regulation is intended, not as insurance of parcels, but as an aid in tracing parcels and as evidence that they were mailed. This receipt will be given on the payment of one cent additional postage on the parcel.

Hitherto parcels valued at \$25 and under could be insured for 5 cents. The new ruling makes a 3-cent rate for parcels valued at less than \$5. On the other hand it extends the limit of insurance from \$50 to \$100 parcels. The present rate is 10 cents insurance for parcels valued between \$25 and \$50, and this rate holds. Parcels from \$50 to \$100 in value may be insured for 25 cents under the new ruling.

Certain Oregon and Washington postoffices are within the first and second zone when distance from Portland is counted as the crow flies. But the mail route is so roundabout that mail must go more than 300 miles to reach them. Under the new ruling these places must be counted as if they were in the third zone and third zone rates paid on parcels. This means that the rate is increased from 5 cents for the first pound and one cent for each additional pound, to 6 cents for the first pound and 2 cents for each additional pound. Ten pound parcels would thus cost 24 cents postage against the former 14 cents.

Larger parcels have been admitted ever since July 16, when a new ruling went into effect. The old limit of added length and girth of parcels, 72 inches, was extended by this ruling to 84 inches. Crates of eggs and boxes of apples are admitted under the new limit.

**NOON TRAIN TAKEN OFF NEW SCHEDULES**
