A MOVE FOR STATE

AID FOR ROADS

The County Court has been
making strenuous efforts to se-
cure State aid on our roads, and
thus get back part of the \$25,000
we pay in State taxes. The fol-
lowing letter seems to indicate
that they have succeeded in at-
tracting attention, and the
Court believes they will in time
secure substantial recognition
of their claims.

"State Highway Commission
"Salem, Nov. 24, 1915.
"Hon. County Court,
"Lincoln County,
"Toledo, Oregon.

"Gentlemen—I wish to meet
the County Courts of all coast
counties from Clatsop to Curry,
inclusive, in Portland during the
meeting of the County Courts,
to have an exchange of views
indicating the status of a road
leading north and south through
Clatsop, Tillamook, Lincoln,
Lane, Douglas, Coos and Curry
counties, to Crescent City. An
invitation has been sent this
date to each of the above
mentioned counties for such a
conference to be arranged for
and the meeting to be held in
Portland the week of the annual
meeting of the County Courts
of the State of Oregon.
"Will you kindly advise your
pleasure in this matter and offer
any suggestions which you may
have to make. Please come
prepared to advise as to the
present condition of said road,
how much additional road is to
be opened up and any informa-
tion which will be of common
interest and value to all the
counties concerned.

LEVIES FOR COUNTY AND

ROADS GROWING SMALLER

The entire levy for county and
road purposes levied in 1913 was
\$173,148. The same levies for
1914 was \$158,392, making a
reduction of \$14,756. The pro-
posed levy for 1915 is \$148,000,
a further reduction of \$10,000.
Thus making in the two years a
reduction of \$24,756. A pretty
good showing for our County
Court.
