The entire levy for county and road purposes levied in 1913 was \$173,148. The same levies for 1914 was \$158,392, making a reduction of \$14,756. The pro-posed levy for 1915 is \$148,000, a further reduction of \$10,000. Thus making in the two years a reduction of \$24,756. A pretty good showing for our County Court.
