ONLY FAIR PLAY ASKED (From the Dallas Observer)

The Observer has taken, and probably will take no part in the primary campaign on behalf of any candidate, still there is one office to be filled that should be filled by a Polk county man at this election, and that is the office of joint representative from Polk and Lincoln counties. In the past there has been a sort of unwritten agreement that Polk county was to have this office at one election, and then Lincoln county at the next. Two years ago, S. G. Irvin, a Lincoln county man, held the office. It is now Polk's turn. This seems only fair, and from present indications, Lincoln county will abide by this understanding and put no man into the field this year, though there has been some talk about a Lincoln county man entering the primaries to contest the primary nomination with Mr. Fuller, the avowed Polk county candidate for this office.

As between two Polk county men aspirants for this office, the Observer could not and would not take any sides, feeling that until after the primaries, it should be neutral. However, it appears that so far as Polk county is concerned, no one other than Mr. W. V. Fuller of Dallas will be a candidate. Of all men who might seek this nomination and office in either of the two counties, Mr. Fuller probably comes as near to being the right man as could be found. He owns considerable property in Lincoln County, and probably pays more taxes in Lincoln county than any other Polk county citizen. He is well acquainted with the needs of both counties. For seven years, Mr. Fuller has been engaged in the drug business in Dallas. He is also quite heavily interested in farming and fruit growing in the vicinity of Dallas, and for the past fifteen years has been closely identified with the timber interests of Polk and Lincoln counties, paying about the same amount of taxes in Lincoln county that he does in Polk. For several years he has been connected with the state forestry department.

Mr. Fuller, as president of the Dallas Commercial Club for five years, has proven himself to be an untiring worker for the upbuilding of the county and the Willamette valley in general. He has given his time unflinchingly to the development work of the organization which he headed for so long a time, and which would undoubtedly be heading at this time had he not refused to take the office longer. His varied enterprises have given him a thorough acquaintance with the needs of this district and of the state, and he is broad minded enough to make a good representative. He has always been a republican. The Observer says this in behalf of Mr. Fuller without prejudice to any other man who may seek the nomination, but we reiterate that Polk county is entitled to this office this year.
