**STATE OF OREGON

STATE TAX COMMISSION**

Dear Sir:

In looking over the reporter's transcript of the proceedings of the Oregon County Assessor's Association, held at Salem, Oregon, February 15, 16, 17, 1916, the effect of high assessed valuations, particularly where assessors have tried to comply with the law is called to mind.

As an official the assessor does not originate a tax of any kind, and does not add a dollar to the tax burden. The several taxing districts, the state, counties, cities, towns, school districts, road districts, etc., initiate and authorize the levying of taxes. The assessor does not add to, nor take from the sums legally authorized by the several taxing agencies. He simply ascertains the property each taxpayer owns.

The standard of value fixed by law in Oregon, is the "Full cash value." The law also requires that the assessor upon the completion of his roll shall make oath that he has diligently and to the best of his ability assessed all property in his county, which by law he is permitted to assess, at the full cash value thereof. No fair-minded man will wish to force the assessor to willfully commit perjury. Suppose the assessor of Lincoln county finds the full cash value of all the property in the county is \$10,000,000, and the amount to be raised is \$200,000, that would be 20 mills or 2 per cent on the dollar; then suppose the taxpayers or the board of equalization would object to so high a valuation and the roll of \$5,000,000, and the levy would be 40 mills or 4 per cent, because, though the valuations may be reduced, the \$200,000 can not be reduced. Therefore no taxpayer is injured because property is assessed at full value. Stick to your scheme of getting full value assessments. If you do you will obey the law, and your conscience will be clear. Your county has not been penalized nor will it be, on account of high valuations, and will pay no more than her fair proportion of the state tax.

In the year 1909 Lincoln County had an assessed valuation of \$4,172,665, that year her percentage of the state tax was .008050. In the year 1910 her assessed valuation was more than doubled, being \$8,456,221, the per cent of state tax was .007822. In 1914 it was .007716, on \$10,000,000, in 1915 it was .007599. You will notice that Lincoln County's proportion of the state tax was not increased because her valuations were high.

Remember fidelity to the law is your best defense—"Hew to the line let the chips fall where they may."
