MAYOR'S PROCLAMATION

Whereas the Common Council of the City of Toledo by its Ordinance No. 140 duly passed on the 6th day of March, 1916, and approved by the Mayor on the same day, and thereafter duly posted as required by law, submitted to the legal voters of said city at a special election duly called and held in said city on the 6th day of May, 1916, a measure the ballot title of which was as follows:

AN ACT

Empowering the City of Toledo to purchase suitable grounds within or without the limits of said City for the use of said City as a Public Park or Playgrounds; to incur indebtedness for the same by issuing warrants on the general fund of said City not exceeding the amount of Two Thousand Two Hundred Dollars; authorizing the improving, caring for and policing the same, and granting to the said City the absolute control thereof.

And Whereas said election was duly and legally held and the returns thereof were duly and legally made and canvassed, and at said election, as shown by the returns thereof and the canvass of said returns, 165 ballots were cast upon said measure, of which 145 were in favor of the adoption of said measure, and twenty were against the adoption of said measure.

And Whereas said measure was approved by a majority of the legal voters of said City voting thereon at said election.

NOW THEREFORE, I R. A. Arnold, the duly elected, qualified and acting Mayor of the City of Toledo, do by this proclamation declare the result of said election as hereinbefore stated, and that the said measure, the ballot title of which is above set forth, was approved by a majority of the votes cast thereon at said election and do accordingly hereby declare said measure to be in full force and effect as a part of the Charter of said City of Toledo from the date of this proclamation.
