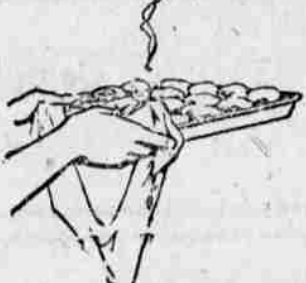

SOCIALIST CONVENTION

About a third of the registered Socialists of Lincoln County met in convention Friday, June 5th, as called previously. They are the first to voice a definite program for reform of county extravagance.

They pledged their nominee for treasurer to return to the county \$400 of his salary of \$800. They pledged their other nominees to take no more than \$3 a day for each 8-hour day of actual work, making no charge for idle days.

The nominee for County Commissioner, the most important office in the county was pledged against the issue of illegal warrants, for economy in contracts for bridges and road work, and for the payment of a reasonable part of the present debt each year so far as possible for him.

The creation of small "shoe-string" school districts was condemned and larger and better schools favored, with a 1-plank footwalk by the side of each much-used road for the pupils in muddy seasons. Pupils lose hundreds of days of school for want of this almost necessity, and thus waste school money.

Representation upon every election board was demanded as a right.

The selection of an official's wife as his deputy was endorsed as the woman is "the better half" of our officials.

The present County Court were unsparringly condemned, but no other officers, as we expect to make a clean sweep of them in November. If we do, we will save the County more than their entire official cost.

It may not be generally known that every Socialist nominee, after his acceptance of the nomination, signs a resignation to be presented by the executive committee if he does not keep his pledges to the party. That is our recall without cost to the county. The candidates named

by the convention are—

J. W. Parrish, Toledo, for County Assessor.
Charles Hart, Rose Lodge, for County School Supt.

H. H. Cook, Waldport, for County Coroner.

Other nominations were passed to be filed by the executive committee later.

All nominations were unanimous except for Sheriff and Assessor. For those offices there were spirited contests. Whether that was because it was felt it would be so easy to beat Bert and Schwartz deponent saith not.
