REGARDING THE PORTS

Dear Editor:

In the last issue of the Leader, noticed a very able article by Hon. B. F. Jones, of Newport, in which the question of the bar and harbor improvement of Yaquina Bay is presented in a very sensible and practicable way. Should the report of the engineers making the permanent survey now ordered be favorable, as we hope and have reason to believe it will be, and the estimate of the cost of improvements be within business limits to secure to us this deep sea harbor and "harbor of refuge" as well, after receiving this information, we should, and I believe we will, feel like proceeding. Our pride of home and our business judgment will encourage and demand that we do.

This will be the biggest one thing that has ever come to this Yaquina Bay country not in actual outlay of money perhaps, but in far-reaching results, in many ways affecting present business and social conditions. As I have stated on other occasions and will again say, this improvement will add more actual value to Lincoln County than the entire county is now worth. We should prepare to meet this condition. The law governing the creation of port districts must be amended, and actual figures and data must be secured relating to commerce, of which we have only an estimate, and other definite data relating to present and future commerce.

Local strife and small bickering have followed us as a people and are still with us, notwithstanding the efforts of broad minded and patriotic citizens who have given their time and energy endeavoring to wipe out such faction lines, and while we admit that local pride is laudable, clannishness and selfishness are not, but it is ever so, while some are building, others are tearing down. While we have this under way and are pledged to pay one half of the cost, we will do so, not because it is right but just because it seems the only way to get the improvements under the present attitude and conditions of the U. S. Government.
