### COMMITTEE REPORTS

#### BRIDGE ACROSS BAY

The Committee appointed last Thursday evening at the meeting of the Improvement Club to view out and locate the proper place for a bridge to connect up with the Beaver Creek, Drift Creek and Mill Creek roads, also to see about securing a right of way, reported at a meeting of the club held Tuesday evening as follows: After investigating what is known as the Mill Creek site, the Butler site, and the Harrison site, which is the present terminus of the road. It was found that a bridge located at this place would be easiest of access, would make shorter connections with the localities benefited and would be cheapest to build. On this side of the river the road would be located directly across the tideland to the Lee Wade or Perkins place, then along the railroad track to town. The cost of the bridge with 1200 or 1500 feet of trestle across the tideland is estimated at \$9000 or less. This estimate includes a concrete pier and draw in the bridge.

The people of the entire south end of the county as well as Toledo and other sections are loudly clamoring for this bridge to be built. This is one of the vital issues to the people of this section and the matter will probably be taken up by the County Court in the near future, and arrangements made for the establishment of this bridge.
