REGARDING COUNTY AGRICULTURIST

A move has been inaugurated by the farmers of Lincoln county, under the auspices of the Grange, for securing a county agriculturist agent for the County. The Grange while always in favor of economy with the tax-payers money, believes that the investment will be wise and will return many times over the money invested.

The County Agent is an important factor in the development of an agricultural community and is so regarded by all leading educators and agricultural journals in the country. There are now 1100 agents in as many counties in the United States and those counties which have taken advantage of the opportunity to obtain one, have, in many cases, made greater strides in scientific and up-to-date farming in two or three seasons than in all time previous.

Tillamook, Lane and Coos, our neighboring counties, with the same climate and land as ours, have advanced wonderfully the past few years, in dairying and a large portion of this advance can be directly attributed to the fact that they have live agricultural agents to aid them not only in producing dairy products economically but also in the marketing of the same. The cow testing associations alone save the farmers

Problems in drainage, fertilization of soil for maximum crops, feeds and feeding for milk and beef production, erection of silos and growing of silage, raising better fruit and care of orchards and all agricultural matters will be the field of the agricultural agent and his services are at the disposal of all persons who may require them.

Petitions are now in circulation by a committee appointed by the Pomona Grange asking the County Court to include in the budget for the coming year the sum of \$1500.00 for the work this sum will be duplicated by the State making the total of \$3000.00. From the experience of other counties this sum will be sufficient to secure a first class man and pay all salaries, office and traveling expenses.
