DR. LINTON'S HOME BURNS

Last Sunday morning the beautiful and well equipped home of Dr. C. E. Linton with practically all of the furnishings, and all of the curios, keepsakes, manuscripts, and other valuables which he had been a lifetime accumulating was burned to the ground, the fire originating from the stove it appears. The Dr. lighted a fire in the stove, set his coffee on to cook and went to ball out his boat, only a short distance off, as he expected to cross the bay after breakfast. Soon after getting to the boat he saw what he thought to be a fog rising in the direction of the house and a few minutes later became aware that it was on fire and gave the alarm which was quickly responded to by the firemen and everything possible was done to save the building but to no avail, and it was soon known that the house and its contents could not be saved, and attention was turned to two small buildings standing near, which by hard work were saved. The loss is about \$3,000 partly insured.—Waldport Watchman.

POLK ASSESSOR WRITES
Dallas, Oregon, August 21, 1916,
Editor Lincoln County Leader,
Toledo, Oregon.

Dear Sir:

In a recent issue of the "Sentinel", in commenting on the advisability of having the timber of Lincoln County cruised for assessment purposes, that paper states "We are informed that Polk County's cruise was highly unsatisfactory and would not stand the test of a suit on the part of the County".

Now the foregoing statement is so unfair and false in every particular, that I ask a little space in your paper in which to give the people of Lincoln County the exact facts regarding the cruise of Polk County's timber lands.

Polk County was cruised in 1908 by W. V. Fuller and the present State Forester, Mr. F. A. Elliott.

The work was done under contract by these gentlemen, they being both sworn in as Deputy Assessors and their reports which are a permanent record, show not only the amount of timber on each forty, but the kind and quality as well, also the topography of the land etc.

I was Assessor of Polk County from 1901 to 1915 and am Assessor of Polk County at the present time, therefore I have had ample opportunity to note difference in the work of the office in placing valuations on timber lands before and since the county was cruised.

I wish to state positively that Polk county's cruise was and is perfectly satisfactory in every particular and I have known of timber lands being bought and sold on the records alone without an additional cruise.

Now as far as the cruise not "standing the test of a suit," I would say that we have never had a hint of any such thing as a suit regarding the accuracy of our records regarding this cruise and I wish to say to the people of Lincoln County that if you get your timber cruised by reliable parties, you will not have any law suits on your hands, as have some of the counties of Oregon at the present time, and further that in my opinion you will not regret going to the expense of having the work done.
