THAT COUNTY AGENT

Harlan, Ore.

Editor Leader
Dear Sir:

I have with interest a letter published in your issue of September 29 signed, Web, of Eddyville, asking that he may have a county agent.

He seems to be badly in need of one, so let him have one, but I think we ought to wait a little while before we engage one.

There are many of us farmers in Lincoln Co. who would like to see a county agent in here, but I think we ought to study the expense as well as the receipts before we take the step.

The agent's salary is about \$2000 per year, stenographer, say \$750, automobile, typewriter and office fixtures, rent, stationery, etc., will bring up the total to about \$4000.00 a year, of which sum the state will furnish about half.

In return we get the services of an expert which of course would be highly appreciated by the majority of farmers if they were so situated that they could get his advice when it was needed most. But how many parts of Lincoln Co. are within easy reach of Toledo, (I presume that is where his office would be) by auto or even by team during the four bad months of the year when most of the help and advice is needed especially as regards stock. In many cases his help would come too late to save an animal—of course his advice would be valuable in preventing a re-occurrence.

There is lots of valuable work he would be able to do from his office but many men won't write a letter if they can possibly help it, not because they are too ignorant as Web thinks but because they don't like writing or don't have time, or are too tired, and even if they did write, how soon could they get a reply, say from any point on Upper Big Elk? Not under five or six days, and a personal visit is a two or three days trip.

Now I think Web has got a very poor opinion of his fellow farmers in Lincoln Co. He calls them moss incrustated conservatives and says many of them are too ignorant to know how to get knowledge. He must live quite a way from Eddyville as I am personally acquainted with some very bright and intelligent men in that part of the county. And he certainly hasn't been in Big Elk much. In fact I think the farmers of Lincoln Co. are as bright and intelligent as can be found in any part of the good old U. S., except perhaps Missouri where they have to be shown.

If they weren't they would not have made the progress they have made in spite of the obstacles they have had to surmount.

I don't think any man who has carved a farm and home out of these log and stump covered hills and made a living at the same time shows much lack of knowledge or ambition.

Our friend goes on to say that the Portland firms urge the appointment of a county agent. Of course they do. That is part of their business. And he can suggest all kinds of improvements which means more money for the farmer to spend and they don't have to help pay him. Let them be satisfied with a little less profit and give the farmer a little more for his produce and they won't need to worry about business. As if they will give the average farmer some money to spend he will spend it with a free hand.

Now Mr. Web what I think we ought to have first, is some good roads over which the merengenum-agent can travel winter and summer whereby he can reach the remote farms as they and the newcomers, who are not used to the climate and conditions, are the ones who need his services most. And when we get it so he can pay a personal visit any time of year, we will then receive a double benefit, one of his personal advice and another, and the more important one of being able to get our produce to market at a reasonable cost.
