#### REGARDING CRAB LAWS

Waldport, Ore., July 5, 1917.

For the benefit of the crabbers on Alsea Bay will you kindly give us an opinion of the following law: Chapter 215—Gen. Laws of 1917—Page 410. Does it prohibit shipping crabs from Alsea Bay.

Dear Sir:—

I have your inquiry bearing date of the 6th instant, together with an enclosure requesting information as to whether or not chapter 215, Laws of 1917, prohibits the shipment of crabs taken from the waters of Alsea Bay.

To this question my answer is no. The provision of said chapter 215 makes criminal the transportation or the offering for shipment or transportation, "or to have in their possession for the purpose of transporting or shipping, any crabs taken or caught in the waters of Yaquina Bay and its tributary streams, in Lincoln County, State of Oregon, during the months of July, August and September of any year."

Neither Alsea Bay nor any of the streams that flow into it are in any sense waters tributary to Yaquina Bay. With reference to waters, the word "tributary" has a well defined meaning. The courts have defined a tributary to be a natural stream running into another stream. Webster's International Dictionary defines "tributary" as "a stream flowing into another stream or into a lake."

The way the term "tributary" is used by the Legislature, evidently means the streams that flow into Yaquina Bay. The only crimes in Oregon are those specified by statute. (State v. Smith, 56 Or. 21; State v. Guant, 13 Or. 115.)

The Legislature then, by chapter 215, only having made criminal the transportation of crabs taken from the waters of Yaquina Bay and its tributaries could not be made to apply to crabs taken from the waters of Alsea Bay or its tributary streams.

There is a law protecting crabs in Coos County, including all bays, harbors and inlets of Coos County. This probably has been confused with the Lincoln County Act which applies only to Yaquina Bay and its tributary streams.
