ABOUT THE EQUALIZA-
TION BOARD

It is being asked why was the
old growth timber of the large
interests lowered and not the
rest? We have asked the ques-
tion our selves, of the men who
know, and find that all was
lowered 10 per cent regardless
of the owner, and upon asking
further why any of it was low-
ered without lowering the other
property, we find that the City
property is lowered and that af-
ter the reduction was made on
the timber it is still assessed at
\$25.00 per acre throughout the
County and the farmers land is
assessed at \$9.60 per acre
throughout the County.

When we ask why the big
ranch just North of the Yachats
was reduced and not other prop-
erty of that vicinity, we find that
it was not reduced at all, but
still has the value placed on it
several years ago by Mr. Ball.
The Yachats townsite was va-
cated by the Court and reduced
30 per cent by the Equalization
Board, but is still valued at
\$9012.50, and there is a little
less than 160 acres of it.

The moral is, Don't ask your
neighbor, but ask the man who

will be better and will stand
higher in the estimation of your-
self and neighbor.

JUNIOR RED CROSS

Some time ago we had a
communication, asking with
regard to the forming of a Jun-
ior Red Cross. In answer to
same we give the following:

The Junior Red Cross is an
official branch of the American
Red Cross, open to every school
child in the United States. When
ever there has been placed in a
local school fund an amount
equal to twenty-five cents for
each pupil, that school becomes
an auxiliary of the Red Cross
and entitled to display a Red
Cross banner. Every pupil at-
tending such a school becomes
a junior member, entitled to
wear a membership button. The
school fund may be raised by
collection or entertainment. For

The Legal Advisory Board for
Lincoln County, Oregon, is com-
posed of C. E. Hawkins, W. H.
Waterbury and G. B. McCluskey.
The Board has recommended as
Associate members, Mamie Rob-
bins of Eddyville; Arthur French
of Taft; O. C. Weller of Wald-
port; and E. S. Snelling of New-
port. The associate members
are appointed by reason of their
locality. By reason of the fact
that all sections of the County
are represented on the Board,
the registrants are saved the ex-
pense and trouble of going to
the County, and can get advice
and assistance in calling on the
nearest member or associate
member of the board. It is the
duty of Legal Advisory Board,
with its associate members, to
provide to the registrants
throughout the county, all the
advice and assistance necessary
in the preparation of claims,
Questionnaires and other papers
submitted to them. It is expect-
ed of the registrants that they
avail themselves of the advice
and assistance of the board, for
it is provided for their use and
there are no costs or fees in con-
nection therewith. O. C. Weller
of Waldport will look after the
business of the board in the
south end of the county, Arthur
French of Taft, the northern
portion of the county, Mamie

JOIN THE RED CROSS
All You Need—A Dollar and
A Heart

Oregon's campaign to enroll
240,000 members in the Ameri-
can Red Cross is in full swing.
Headquarters for the state have
been established in Portland and
headquarters for the County
have been established in Toledo,
at the home of George R.
Schenck. Organization will be
extended into every precinct and
section of Lincoln county. There
is no doubt that Lincoln county
as usual, will respond to the call
of our Country in a generous
way.

This campaign is nation wide
and is a movement to increase
the membership of the Red
Cross to 15,000,000 and provide
the United States with a large
and effective machine for war
relief work. President Wilson
has declared himself for a well
organized and efficient Red
Cross. He says—"The best way
in which to impart energy to
the relief work of the war,
will be to concentrate it in the
hands of a single experienced
organization which has been
recognized by law and interna-
tional convention as the public
instrumentality for such work."

The energies of this campaign
in its national and local work
will be directed towards making
the Red Cross larger and more
powerful. The particular pur-
pose of this movement is to en-
roll one dollar members, and no
especial emphasis will be placed
on other classes of membership,
except that where the opportu-
nity is presented the advisability
of the \$2.00 membership includ-
ing the Red Cross Magazine will
be urged.

The object of this drive is to
secure a membership of 30 per
cent of the population of the
state and Lincoln county is
supposed to turn in 30 per cent
of the population which would
be 2,000. Lincoln county al-
ways has done her duty and it
is up to us now to live up to our
reputation.

The drive will start on Mon-
day the 16th of December and
close on Christmas Eve. And
on Christmas Day every mem-
ber of the Red Cross will wear
a Button and display a Service
Flag in their window at home
and on Christmas Eve a lighted
candle is to be placed behind
the Flag so that the great Red
Cross will be displayed. Let us
see that there is a Service Flag
of the Red Cross in every home
and members in every family.

One thing we wish to promise
the people of Lincoln County is
that one half of the money
raised will be retained at home
and where there is an auxiliary
to the Red Cross one half of the
money raised from there will be
refunded to them by the Toledo
Red Cross to be used for Red
Cross purposes as you see fit.

From the Lincoln county head
quarters the command goes
forth; That every man and wo-
man in Lincoln county must
join the Red Cross. If you are
already a member pay your dues
and receive a Service Flag. The
Slogan of this campaign is;

"Join the Red Cross—All
you need;—A dollar and a
heart."
