HAVE YOU ANY SPRUCE?

Co-operation of the Northwest
in helping the Spruce Production
Division of the Signal Corps
compile data on available sup-
plies of spruce timber and logs
is earnestly requested by Colo-
nel Brice P. Disque, command-
ing the division.

Colonel Disque explains that
the Government finds it impera-
tive to get a general inventory of
spruce and spruce logs of air-
plane stock grade immediately.
For this reason reports from
owners and others on supplies in
their control or owned by other
parties are sought.

Informants are asked to give
approximate number of board
feet and location of standing
timber and also to furnish data
on logs that are in the water,
mentioning the length of time
they have been there.

Such information should be
addressed immediately to Colo-
nel Brice P. Disque, Command-
ing Spruce Production Division,
Signal Corps, U. S. Army, Yeon
Building, Portland, Oregon.
