Well here I am again with the request to send the Leader to a new address. Uncle Sam is very kind, he sends us from place to place. The 14th U. S. is divided all over the Pacific northwest and Alaska and went to see France for some time, sorry to say.

I am first cook now. I was helper for a month, one day second cook, next day first, but not because I am a good cook, ha ha. Nobody wanted the job, so I accepted it for a short time, trying to do my bit in every line of duty.

Bill of Fare, Feb. 4th, 1918:

Breakfast:—Franks, Fried Potatoes, Oatmeal and Milk, Apples, Bread, Butter and Coffee.

Dinner:—Roast Beef, Mashed Potatoes, Gravy, Pumpkin Pie, Bread Pudding, Celery, Bread and Coffee.

Supper:—Chili Con Carne, Spanish Rice, Muffins, Creamed Parsnips, Coffee and Bread.

I feel altogether at home under the Stars and Stripes. Never had a punishment yet, in fact love America more since I joined the Colors than I did before.
