Finding that Oregon communities are being fed up on falsehoods of various kinds, that the people here as elsewhere are repeating these stories for truth and are thus creating a morale that is injurious to the cause which brought the United States to declare war on Germany, the administration at Washington is asking the people of this state to refrain from passing judgment on the way the war is being won, or from saying and doing things that will destroy confidence.

WITH THE NAVY

(Extracts from a letter received by G. O. Adams of Upper Big Elk, from his son, R. O. Adams, who enlisted in the Navy at Bremerton, Washington, two months ago.)

Dear Parents:—

Have sure got some news for you this time—am one of a contingent picked out of the training camp here at Seattle to leave immediately for service in the Atlantic Ocean, to help destroy the Kaiser's submarines and thereby make the ocean safe for Civilization. These of us who have been picked out have received an advancement in their rating and our pay has been increased \$5.90 a month, and we have a furlough for two days, but it will not give me time to visit you before we leave. By the time you receive this letter I will be on my way to San Francisco by boat.

Am not sure but I believe we go by way of the Panama Canal. Expect to see some of the ocean anyway before I shall be able to see you again. Now Mama, do not worry about me.

I am more positive than ever that it is a solemn obligation and duty that I owe to God, my Country and my parents, as well as to Civilization to do my bit, and I am just itching to have an opportunity to help destroy and cause the downfall of that arch criminal, the Kaiser, and his clique. And you can be positively certain that I shall always be found doing my duty and if perchance the submarine gets me, just try to remember that if it is not me, it is some other mother's son. I am entirely satisfied and willing to take my chances because that is the only way we can "Can the Kaiser" and he cannot get us all that is certain.
