A LETTER
 Toledo, Oregon, April 30th, 1918.
 To Editor Lincoln County Leader:—
 Will you kindly find space in your paper for the Red Cross notice given below. This is not meant in any arbitrary way, but by many it is believed to be well to divide the County into districts, designating these districts in some definite way, that each sub-chapter may know the extent of their territory, and that the citizens may be informed in which sub-chapter district they reside.

As Lincoln County is divided into three port districts, the boundary lines of these port districts are considered to be convenient for sub-chapter districts except the Beaver Creek and Oysterville neighborhoods where the port district lines divide these communities. Other than these port district line will govern. But in these two above mentioned exceptions, it would probably be best if they elect which sub-chapter they wish to belong.

Red Cross Districts:
 The Alsea port district—Waldport sub-chapter district.
 The Newport port district—Newport sub chapter district.
 The Toledo port district—Toledo sub-chapter district.

OF DANISH NATIVITY
 J. H. H. Andersen of Newport was in the city yesterday having just returned from a canvass of the north part of the county in the interests of his candidacy for sheriff. WAR WORKERS CONFERENCE
 War workers of every city and community are urged by Governor Withycombe to participate in the first Oregon War Conference, to be held in Portland, May 22 and 23, under the auspices of the State Council of Defense. In a statement issued Governor Withycombe says:
 "Because many matters of vital importance will be discussed at Oregon's first war conference to be held in Portland May 22 and 23, I respectfully urge the war workers and officials in the cities and communities of Oregon, to make their best effort to be present and participate in the proceedings which are to be conducted under the auspices of the State Council of Defense.
 So many of the war time emergencies arising in the various local communities are of a similar nature that it would be both helpful and wise to exchange views looking toward a uniform or co-operative treatment of the different situations insofar as a general plan could be worked out feasibly and comprehensively.
 The success of the coming conference depends largely of course, upon the measure of support given by the war workers of Oregon who have thus far enthusiastically and whole-heartedly promoted the general patriotic programme. May I not, therefore, rely upon the loyal people of Oregon to assist the State Council of Defense in accomplishing constructive results?"
