SKILLED LOGGERS AND LUMBERMEN WANTED

A call for 175 men skilled in logging and sawmill work must be filled by volunteers from Oregon by July 23, or enough men will be drafted from special and limited service men in Class 1 to fill the quota.

The skilled workmen required are as follows:

70 chokermen, 50 head buckers, 2 doggers, 6 general sawmill foremen and 25 planer trimmermen.

Volunteers for this service must be of draft age, and are particularly desired from classes 2, 3, and 4. Those who volunteer for the work will be sent to Vancouver, Washington, for engagement in producing spruce for aeroplanes, which is one of the most important branches of the whole service just now.

"These are exceptional opportunities for energetic and ambitious men," says the War Department circular calling for the men. "The men inducted under these calls will be engaged in producing spruce for aeroplanes in the great Northwest woods."

DOWN WITH MOSQUITOES

That the western newt or water-dog is an effective means of getting rid of mosquitoes is pointed out by Dr. Asa C. Chandler of the Oregon Agricultural College Experiment Station.

One or two water-dogs in each rain barrel will be sufficient to keep them clear of mosquito larvae has been conclusively shown, according to Dr. Chandler. The only requisites for their successful exploitation in this capacity are that the barrels be free from oil, tar, brine, or other injurious substances. The water-dogs do not injure the water in any way. Reservoirs, millponds, and garden pools could almost invariably be stocked successfully with water-dogs in climates in which they will thrive.

THE GERMAN DOCKS

The taking over by the United States of the title and possession of the docks, piers, wharves, and other shipping property on the Hudson River, owned by the German steamship companies, the Hamburg corporations, is greeted with universal approval by the American people. The property is to be retained by the government and not turned back to its former owners at the close of the war.

Purchasers of Liberty Loan Bonds and War Savings Stamps, who supply the money used for this purpose, may feel especial gratification. These docks and piers and warves are strategic points of great importance and value, and it is intolerable that they should remain in enemy hands, or that they should ever revert to German ownership. German commerce has been shown to have been so indissolubly bound up with, and so much a part of German Militarism, that it is just and right that it should suffer all the penalties of war.
