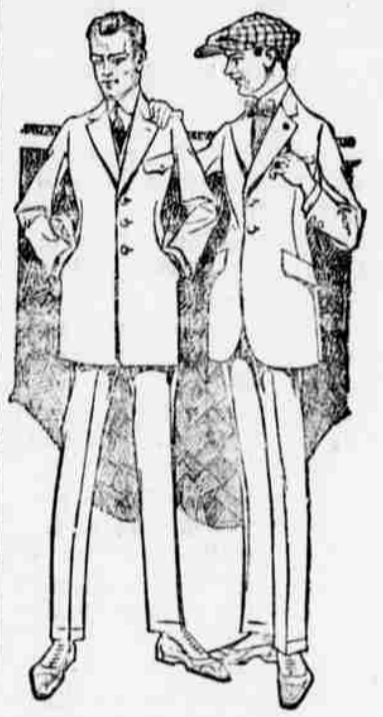

NOTICE OF PROPOSED SIDEWALK CONSTRUCTION

Notice is hereby given that the City Council contemplates the following improvement within the City of Toledo:

The construction of a sidewalk on the west side of Hill Street, between the north side of the intersection of Hill and Fifth Streets and one hundred feet north of the north side of the intersection of Hill and Sixth Streets, said walk to be constructed of plank two inches thick and ten feet long, laid cross wise and securely spiked to stringers running length wise. The said stringers to be at least four in number and to be at least two inches thick and six inches wide, set up edgewise.

This notice is given by order of the Common Council of the City of Toledo and is published for three weekly consecutive issues in the Lincoln County Leader, a newspaper published and of general circulation within Toledo, Lincoln County, Oregon, beginning with the issue of August 23d, 1918, and ending with the issue of September 6th, 1918. Within 10 days from the final publication of this notice the owners of more than a two-thirds majority of the superficial area of the property adjacent to said street to be improved, may file with the Recorder a written remonstrance against the proposed improvement. If no such remonstrance be filed, the City Council will immediately commence to make the proposed improvement as hereinabove set out.
