We are informed that the county tractor will be put to work hauling gravel on the Siletz road in the near future.

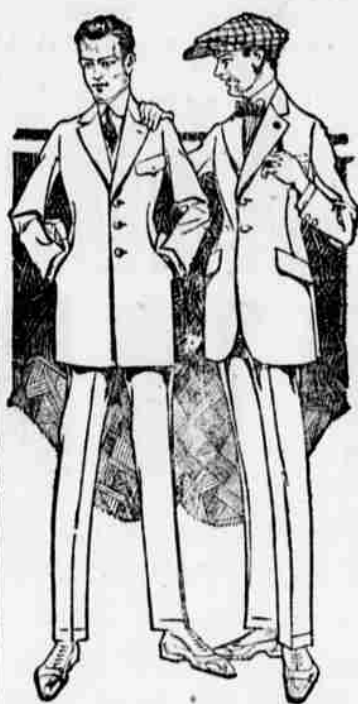
Section Foreman Murphy is moving into the Burnett house this week, same having been recently vacated by H. G. Guild.
