"WITH THE COLORS"

Camp Mills, N. J.
Nov. 4, 1918.

Dear friend Fern:—
Will drop you a few lines and let you and friends of Lincoln county know that I finally got separated from the rest of the bunch which left Toledo together. The last I saw of them Wren Emerson and Lloyd Porter were at Camp Fremont and Willie Kessi left for Camp Grant, Illinois while we were at Camp Lewis.

We started on our journey from Fremont, Calif., Oct. 23. It was sure a fine trip. I enjoyed it fine as we would get off once or twice a day and march around for exercise, and usually in some large city, as we came through several of them. So you see it was not tiresome as the scenery was always new.

I sure give the Red Cross credit for the good work which they are doing. They always met us with fruits, smoking, coffee etc., and a cup of hot coffee sure goes good where the weather is zero, which it was coming through the plateau of the Rockies.

I also want to thank the Toledo Embroidery Club for the sewing kit, (or house-wife, as they may call it), which they gave us boys before leaving Toledo. Because if there's a button missing, or a small hole in your uniform, a person gets K. P. or fatigue duty. So I think the house-wife has saved me several days extra work, as I have just got one button left, and am pretty near out of thread.

We arrived in New York Oct. 30. She's some burg, alright, it's bigger than Toledo, but the climate is about the same at present. We then took the ferry from there to Long Island, where we are camped now. But don't expect to be here long, as chances look pretty good for sailing.

So I suppose there will be a few fish fed as many of the boys haven't been on the ocean before. But hope we all reach our embarkment safe, as I would sure like to go over the top and return with a few notches on my rifle with the rest of the Lincoln county boys.

I suppose the next draft will get some of the older birds down there, such as Gus Olson and Al Waugh. Well, they sure take the kinks out of a person's back alright.

I got most of my drilling at Fremont. On target practice I averaged up with some of the best shots, but that's nothing uncommon. I never saw a Lincoln county boy yet that couldn't shoot. Ask Vern Jones or Stanley Anderson, they know.

I also got the gas mask test, which an exciting training to go through.

Well Fern, guess I will have to ring off for now, as we have a limited time to stay up.

Will let you hear from me later, as it's easier to write one letter in the army than several, and most of the people in Lincoln county takes the Leader, so it will answer the purpose till I return. Then I don't think the Lincoln County Leader or the Oregonian either will be big enough to write my story in.
