SUMMONS

In the Circuit Court of the State of Oregon for Lincoln County

IN THE NAME OF THE STATE OF OREGON:

You are hereby summoned and required to appear and answer the Complaint in the above entitled suit now on file in the above entitled Court and cause, on or before six weeks from the date of the first publication of this Summons, to-wit: on or before November 29th, 1918; and you are hereby notified that if you fail to so appear and answer said Complaint as herein required, for want thereof, plaintiff will apply to the above entitled Court for the relief demanded in the plaintiff's said Complaint, namely, for a Decree that plaintiff have and recover of said defendant the sum of Five Hundred Dollars with interest thereon at the rate of eight per cent per annum from May 19th, 1916, until paid, and one hundred three and 87/100 dollars taxes paid with interest thereon from October 5th, 1918, until paid, at the rate of six per cent per annum, and the further sum of seventy-five dollars as a reasonable attorney's fee, and for his costs and disbursements, and that said several sums be made and decreed a first prior, and subsisting lien and charge against and upon the following described real property with its appurtenances, to-wit:

The southeast quarter of the southwest quarter of Section twenty-six, and the west one half of the northwest quarter, and the northeast quarter of the northwest quarter of section thirty-five, all in Township of even south of range ten west of the Willamette Meridian, situate in Lincoln County, State of Oregon.

That said real property be ordered sold in the manner provided by law and the practice of said Court as similar property is sold upon execution to satisfy said several sums with accruing costs and that plaintiff be empowered to bid at sale, should he desire, and that mortgage execution issue to enforce said Decree, and that the defendant and all claiming, by, through, or under him, subsequent to February 19th, 1913, the date of said mortgage, be forever barred and foreclosed of all right, title, estate, lien, interest and equity of redemption therein (saving only the statutory right as provided by law) and for such further, other or separate relief as shall in equity be meet and to justice appertain.
