MARKET FOR LOCAL PRODUCE

If you have any vegetables, fruit, meat or anything else in the edible line to sell, get in touch with the County Agent's Office. Mess Officers of the local camp have requested the County Agent to locate sources of supply of these products and express a desire to buy as much as possible locally. "There is considerable demand also," says Mr. Cooter, for apples, potatoes, chickens, turkeys, ducks and other miscellaneous crops from parties other than the soldiers. The other day a man came to the office wanting to know what to do with his apples. I introduced him to the mess officers who happened to be in the office at the time. The other day Mr. Casady told me he had sold several barrels of cider and a quantity of apples. I can attest to the quality of his apples and cider for he brought me in a box and a jug of cider. We appreciate this favor but the important part is this: We want to find a market for all local produce and to this end I am anxious to have all producers desiring a market send in a note of their products giving quantity, quality and price. Of course I cannot guarantee a sale but will do the best I can to find buyers."

THE LUMBER INDUSTRY

Two hundred representatives of the West Coast lumbermen met in conference the past week and decided the outlook for that industry was very good.

All admit there will be a temporary period of readjustment and only the immediate future is doubtful of available business. Manufacturers were seriously concerned about maintaining present high wages, and hoped that market conditions and demands would enable them to pay the present scale.

Government price fixing regulations expire Jan. 15th, and these will be sought to be continued until demand for common lumber for building purposes revives.

The masses of the people will not build or plan construction that makes a demand for common lumber or artificially high wages in the building trade.
