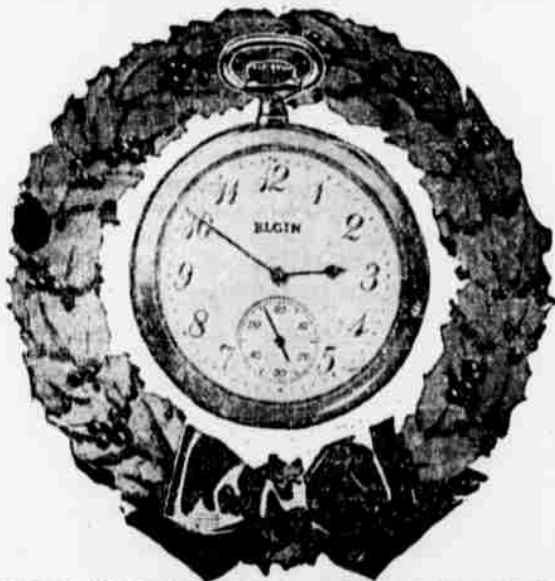

Restoration to Entry of Lands in
National Forest. Notice is hereby
