"SOMEWHERE IN FRANCE"

Following are extracts from letters received by H. S. Porter of Norton, from their son, Lloyd who is now in France with the 8th Division.

Brest, France

Dear Folks:- I will write to let you know that I am still in France and am quite feeling fine. We have good quarters here the barracks are made of corrugated iron, have good bunks to sleep in and good stoves so you may know we are comfortable.

I am checking in a warehouse, and we sure handle a lot of stuff. It is still raining and I guess it never stops. I saw two soldiers trying to pull another out of the mud the other day, the mud sure is a fright.

We can get cigarettes and tobacco here. We get chewing tobacco for 65c a plug, and cigarettes that cost 20c in the States we get for 8c and 9c. We get paid in French money, it is sure funny looking stuff. I am learning to talk French pretty fast, the first week I learned to say "we," while now I can say "we we."

Part of our Division is still in the States, they only got as far as Camp Mills. I don't know when we will be sent home, but I think I will celebrate the Fourth of July in the States. I got my Xmas package and one from the Y. M. C. A., they were great. We had mince pie for Christmas dinner and I think we will have some

today as I saw the cook rolling out the dough with a wine bottle. I would like to have some of the good fruit we raise on the ranch. The oranges and apples here are about the size of hen eggs, we can get 4 apples for a Franc and one orange for 15c. There are quite a bunch of German prisoners here in camp. They have been out working every day. They asked one if he yelled "Kamerad," and he said, "I sure did."

I haven't seen Carl Edwards or Dan Chamberlain since we landed but Dan was in the hospital the last I heard. He is in this camp, but there are so many here it is hard to find anyone.

I went to Brest New Years Day, the streets there are narrow, the buildings are old fashioned and made of stone, but the large stores have a fine window display as a rule.

Of the traveling I have done while on this trip, I liked the trip from Albany to Sacramento the best, crossing the mountains and the trip down the Sacramento River was sure fine. There was lots of good scenery when we crossed the Rocky Mountains but from there to the Atlantic it was practically all the same.

If you could listen to a couple of French sailors sing and not get sick or die, you would live a long time. The person who wrote "Somewhere in France" is the Lily, was never here. The one that wrote "Home Sweet Home," was no slouch though, and when you get about 15,000 miles from home you will believe it too.

I have not seen "Old Bill" yet, guess he is still in Holland. Be sure and send the "Leader" and "Journal" to me for reading material is scarce over here and American newspapers certainly look good.

Will close for this time, with lots of love to all.
