

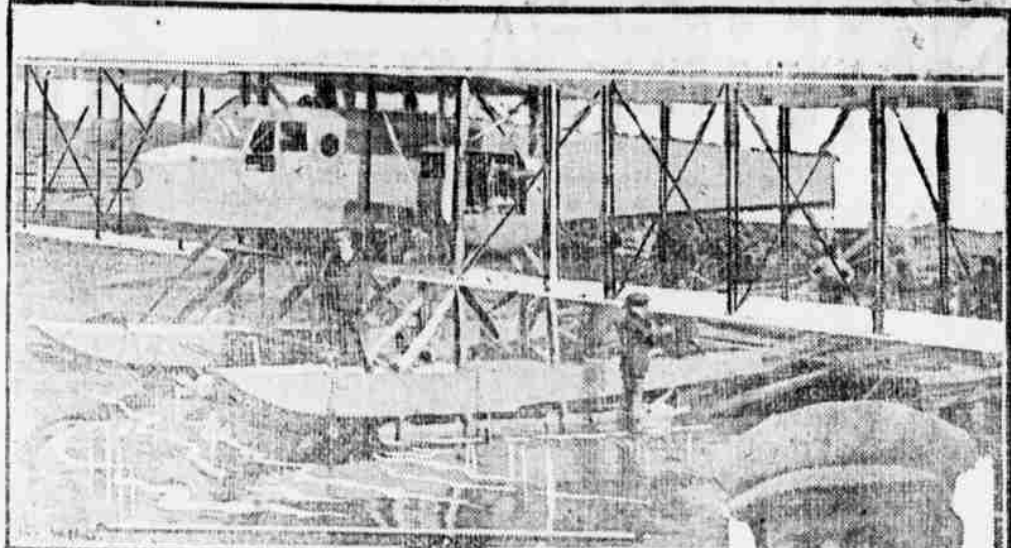

### Swedish Aviator Ready for Historic Atlantic Flight



Plying the Atlantic in 22 hours may be recorded into history within the next few weeks if this great seaplane performs as planned. Captain Sundstedt, Swedish aviator of Paris to Stockholm fame, is to pilot the machine from its dock at Bayonne, N. J. The giant plane project has been financed by a wealthy Norwegian and is an

independent venture. The machine will carry the pilot and four passengers on this attempt for the first flight across the ocean. Pontoon floats filled with supplies enough to last a week will keep the machine afloat should the engine fail. The route is planned from St. John, Nova Scotia, to Queenstown, Ireland, a distance of 1800 miles.

### FIRST IN BERLIN HIS YANK REWARD.



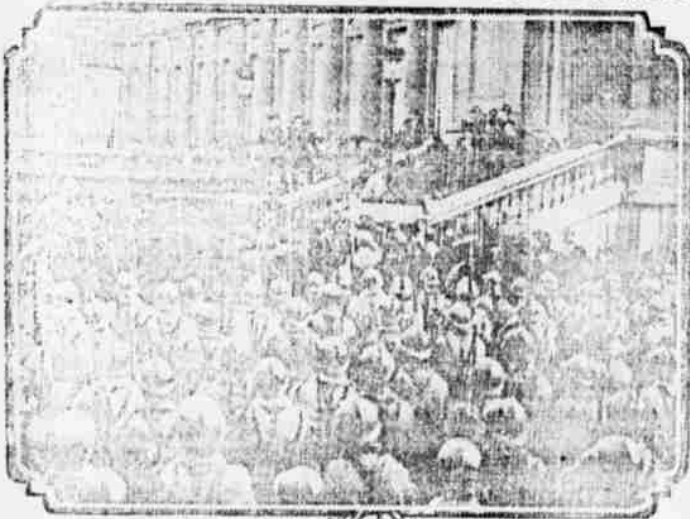

### Bolsheviks Feel Yank Fangs



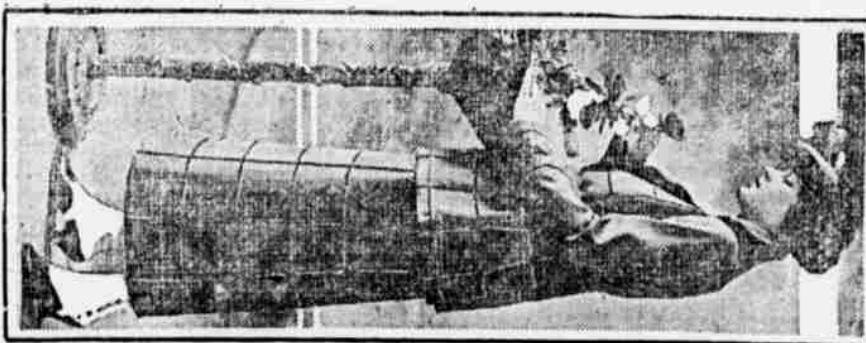
