PIONEER DOCTOR KNOWS NEED OF ROADS

I have lived in Lincoln County for more than 40 years, and I know something of the hardships the pioneers have passed through, for the lack of transportation. The county has been shut off from the business world for all these years. The great resources of the county have lain dormant for the want of means to develop them. No one would invest money where there was such little hope to get adequate returns, and we have, therefore, for these long years, been waiting for something to turn up.

Thousands of dollars have been needlessly spent in the last 40 or 50 years in the transporting goods from Toledo to Siletz, over almost impassable roads in the winter. Many a wagon has been wrecked and horses killed on these miserable roads.

Now, the time has come and the opportunity is just at our door to have all these difficulties removed. The Roosevelt Highway, fathered by one of our own citizens, is to be voted on June 3d. If it is adopted and the road built, every person in the county will be benefited, land will advance in value, and these isolated and neglected places will be opened to the markets of the world, both by land and sea. The coast counties can then be made as productive and beautiful as the famous Willamette Valley, and the Roosevelt Highway will complete this long desired relief. The highway will be one of the finest scenic roads in the world, a counterpart of the famous Columbia Highway.

Now is the time to strike, the iron is hot, and if the opportunity is lost, it may never return. The people of Lincoln County should not fail to vote solid for this important measure. The government will put up half the cost of construction and the people of the state the other half by taxation. This will fall equally on all taxpayers, because all parts of the state will be benefited. "There is a tide in the affairs of man if taken in the flood leads on to fortune." F. M. Carter.

HIGHWAY WILL "OPEN UP SILETZ"

The Siletz Reservation has been settled since 1855, mostly by Indians, until about fifteen years ago, since which time the white population has been slowly increasing through the purchase of land from the Indians and by homesteading ceded land. It embraces a tract of land north of Yaquina Bay bordering on the Pacific Ocean twenty-four miles and extending fifteen miles eastward. The greatest portion is owned in fee by Indian and white men and subject to taxation, most of the remainder will be owned in like manner in a short time because of the expiration of the trust titles and sale of allotments.

The reservation contains one of the largest and finest bodies of timber and is an ideal section for dairying, particularly because of its fine soil and climatic conditions which permits pasturing of stock during the greater part of the year. The timber is practically untouched and the agricultural resources have not been developed much more than to demonstrate what can be done in that line when transportation facilities are provided.

The reservation, like other parts of the coast section, is capable of supporting a large population when roads are provided and the building of the Roosevelt Highway will give it the opportunity needed.
