CLEVELAND PRESS* POINTS MORAL

Lieut. W. K. Patterson brought us in a copy of his home paper, the Cleveland, Ohio, Press, in which is an able editorial which points a moral for our Oregon orchardists.

The editorial begins, "It is absurd that Ohio should depend on far off places like Oregon for any of its cooking and eating apples."

"Then a little further along it says, 'Time was when Ohio was famous as an apple state. It has lost not just as Delaware lost its first standing in peaches. Ohio now ranks ninth, producing about one thirty-fifth of the national apple crop.'"

The article goes on to show that the reason Ohio lost out in the apple industry was because they did not keep their orchards up. Trees pruned and sprayed and the soil fertilized.

Moral: Don't fall into the same rut that the Ohio orchardists did.

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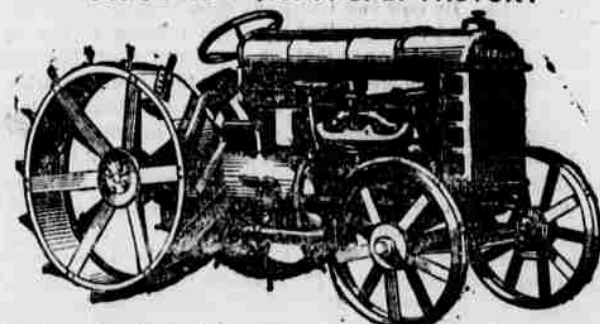


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
