SECRETARY'S REPORT HIGHWAY CAMPAIGN

The final returns on the button sales put on in connection with the Roosevelt Highway campaign this spring are just available from the secretary's office. This report does not indicate the total sales in the county, as buttons were sent from Portland headquarters direct to Newport, and from there, distributed to other portions of the county.

Total buttons received from Portland, 450; total buttons sold, 238; buttons returned from Secretary's office, 114; buttons not sold and not returned, by committeemen as follows: Geo. Campbell, Yaquina, 17; C. E. Linton, Waldport, 15; O. V. Hart, Yachats, 14; Lester Martin, Newport, 52; to balance account, 450.

The sale of buttons was distributed as follows: Toledo territory, 126; Newport, 48; Eddyville, 16; Waldport, 35; Yachats, 11; Yaquina, 3.

This balance fund has been reported to Mr. J. W. Dunn, Peterson Hardware Company, R. S. Van Cleve, Lincoln County Bank, and J. E. Cooter (formerly the W. P. DAIRY OFFERS SHORT COURSE

A three-months short course on butter and cheese making will be given by the O. A. C. dairy department, January 5-April 2. For experienced makers this course will be shortened to two months and will provide a diploma to those who finish February 28. Factory management, pasteurization, neutralization, workmanship in butter and

uniformity in composition, as well as general instruction and practice in butter and cheese making, will be given. Estimated cost of two months course, \$50.
