Mrs. W. H. Burton, representing Mrs. A. T. Peterson the local chairman of the Nation-Wide Campaign in the Episcopal Church, attended the Convocation held in Corvallis Wednesday, returning home today. Mr. White was an overseas chaplain and has recently been discharged and accepted appointment to Roseburg and vicinity.

RESOLUTION

Toledo, Oregon, Nov. 17th, 1919. WHEREAS, The Miami Construction Company that has the contract with the Ports of Toledo and Newport for the building of the South Jetty, did on the 11th day of November, 1919 give written notice to the said Port Commissioners that owing to the fact that the Company had "sustained such enormous loss and are continuing to sustain such enormous loss in our daily operations that it now becomes impossible for us to bear the burden any longer," and that they were unable to further finance the work, and would be compelled to quit the work and throw up their contract unless some adjustment could be made where by the Ports would help finance the work and A. U. C. Berry, General manager of the said Miami Construction Company, did on said 11th day of November 1919, inform the Commissioners at a joint Port District meeting of the Ports of Toledo and Newport that the said Miami Construction Company would cease work on said construction of said Jetty and throw up their contract within ten days from the date of the said written notice unless an adjustment was made where by the Ports would assume a portion of the cost of the construction of said work on said Jetty.

WHEREAS, The Port Commissioners at said joint meeting of November 11th 1919, passed a resolution asking for the Commercial Clubs of the two Port Districts to meet and elect delegates who would meet at the City Hall in the city of Newport, Lincoln County, Oregon and to report to a mass meeting of the citizens and taxpayers of

the said Port Districts that the matter could be discussed and the sentiment of the taxpayers ascertained as to what they would advise to be done in the premises.

WHEREAS, At the said time and date, the 15th day of November, 1919, a Mass meeting was held pursuant to said resolution and after discussing the matter the said mass meeting of citizens of said Port Districts, passed the following resolution: "Resolved that the contractors complete the contract in accordance with the plans and specifications."

Now therefore in consideration of the premises and in view of the fact that the contract plans and specifications existing by and between the Miami Construction Company and the Ports of Newport and Toledo provide that in the case of the said Miami Construction Company fail to perform the covenants of the contract and plans and specification, that the Ports of Toledo and Newport shall have the right to take possession of and use all plants, materials and supplies or parts thereof prepared for or in use at the works, together with all the leases, right-of-way, and quarry privileges by purchase at a value of, or rental at a rate which shall be determined by the Engineer.

In view of the fact that the said Miami Construction Company has failed to comply with the contract, plans, and specifications wherein provided and have also given written notice to the Ports of Toledo and Newport that they will abandon the work on the 21st day of November, 1919, and in view of the fact that there is a large portion of the said South Jetty that is only partly completed and is therefore in great danger of being washed out, which would entail the loss of the said Port Districts of thousands of dollars and it is of vital importance that said work on the construction of the said South Jetty be continued, now therefore, Be It Resolved that the Manager of the Miami Construction Company, and the President and Secretary and the Directors of the said Company and the Bondsmen of the said Miami Construction Company be duly notified as by law required.

That in accordance with the contract and plans and specifications entered into by and between the Miami Construction Company and the Ports of Toledo and Newport and for the reason that the said Miami Construction Company has failed to do and perform the conditions of said contract and plans and specifications therein provided that the said Ports of Toledo and Newport have this day declared their contract forfeited and broken, and the said Miami Construction Company and their said Bondsmen are hereby notified that the Ports of Toledo and Newport will proceed to complete the improvements of the said South Jetty as provided for in said contract and the said plans and specifications, and assume the use of all plants, materials and things provided for in the said specification.

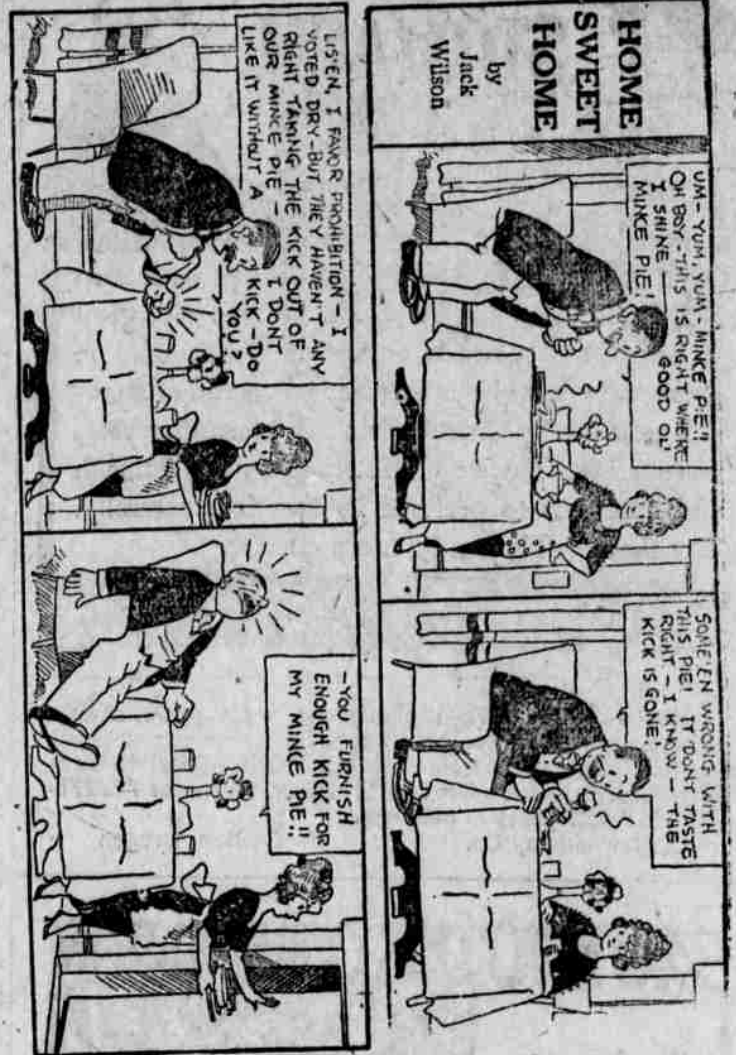

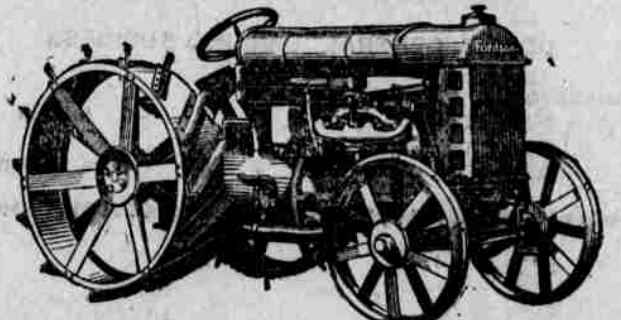
