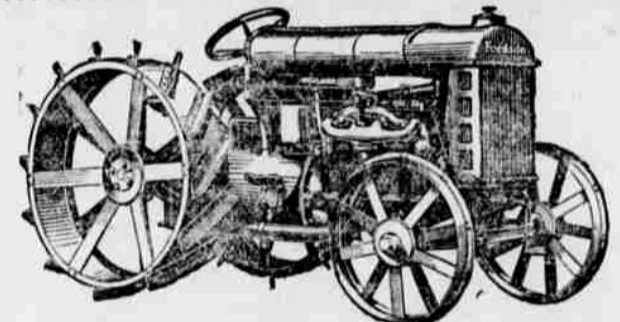

REGARDING MID-YEAR EXAMINATIONS Rewards in the way of exemptions from Mid-year examinations are offered to those pupils having the following standing: For total exemption: General average of 85 per cent or better, with average for no subject below 70 per cent, and with no absence or tardy marks (excusable if on account of personal sickness or of sickness in the immediate family, or if on account of calamity) and if department has at all times been satisfactory.

Beginning Wednesday afternoon, February 4th, and ending Friday P. M. February 6th, examinations will be given for the benefit of those who do not classify under the above heads. In counting the yearly average, the Mid-year and Final examination grades will each have the same effect as one monthly grade. It is intended that thorough reviews be given in each subject which has been taught during the year, and that all members of each class be required to give the same attention to preparation and recitation, whether they are or not expecting exemption. Those who are exempt from all the examinations will not be expected to return during the examinations. If one has partial exemption, he will be expected only during the time of the examination in those subjects in which he is not exempt. It should be remembered, however, that those who thus earn a vacation would of right lose their exemptions if they should in any way disturb those who do take the examinations.

In arriving at a conclusion regarding these exemptions, we consider: A plus 95; A minus 92; B plus 88; B minus 82; C plus 78; C minus 72; U between 50 and 70. We have used every means, we think, to give every one opportunity to show up such a record as will entitle exemption. If some have failed to present this kind of data for the Mid-year term, let it be remembered that practically the same regulations will obtain exemptions from the examinations at the close of the year. Only it should be stated that the matter of excuses must be looked after by each pupil as occasion arises instead of waiting until near the close of the term. Furthermore it should be born in mind that an excuse is in no way an excuse unless it shows a reason. Respectfully, W. A. Cox.
