CLUBS BEING FORMED

Oregon Agricultural College, Corvallis.—Lincoln County may well be proud of the record being made by the students of the Rose Lodge regions according to H. C. Seymour, State Club Leader of Oregon. In this section two or three very strong and live county clubs have been developed and the community boasts of several county winners. The Boys' and Girls' club work aim to teach achievement and to develop leaders to the end that they may assist in the betterment of the community, county, state and nation.

The Boys' and Girls' club work is a permanent educational organization conducted by the extension service department of education. The object of this class of work is to interest the boys and girls in farm and home activities, to train their hands and minds for productive employment.

While the college gives all the assistance possible in the formation of these clubs, it is necessary that local leaders be developed to carry out the work of organization.

One of the most efficient leaders of the state is Mrs. Mattie Carr of Waldport. During the present school year she has organized three clubs, a poultry club, girls cooking club and a garden club. Each of these clubs promises to make a good showing and it is hoped that many of their members will be represented in the industrial contests for the Oregon boys and girls to be conducted at the Oregon State Fair.

In general the club work gives the boy and girl who enrolls in the project the training for the future will make that boy or girl 19 to 15 years from now a worthy citizen of the state of Oregon, point out those in charge.

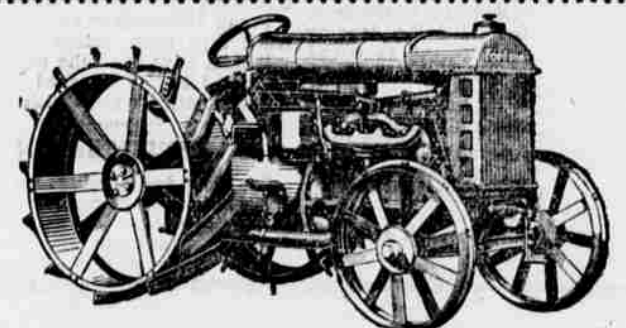
