AUTO LICENSE FEES
No increase in auto license fees is required in order to pay the interest and principal of all state highway bonds that can be issued under the pending 4% constitutional amendment that will be voted upon at the May 21 election. Neither is any increase required in the gasoline tax. Nor is any tax on property involved.

Revenue from the auto license fees and gas tax at present rates will be ample to care for both interest and principal of all the bonds that can be issued under the proposed 4% limitation. The present limit is 2% of the assessed value of property in the state. The increase is necessary in order to make it possible to complete the main state highways within the next few years, instead of waiting indefinitely for their completion from annual revenues. By issuing the bonds the roads can be provided for use while the auto license fees and gas taxes are being paid.
