Divide in halves; roll out one half thin; put on in small pieces haif remaining shortening; fold upper and lower edges in to center; fold sides in to center gold; sides to center again; roll out thin and put on pie plate. Repeat with other half for top crust.

Apple Pie

114 cups flour
115 tenspoons Royal Baking

slices; sprinkle with sugar; flaver with cimamon or nutmeg;

water; roll out remainder of pasity; cover pla, pressing edges try; cover pia, pressing edges ti htly together and baka in moderate oven 30 minutes.
