Under the direction of the Oregon State Chamber of Commerce representatives, an intensive canvass will be conducted in Toledo, beginning next Monday June 21st, in connection with the expansion movement of the State Chamber to raise a budget of \$450,000 covering a three year period, to carry on its program of development work. Of this amount, \$150,000 is to be raised in Portland, and the remainder throughout the State.

The appeal of the State Chamber for funds to carry on its work is based strictly on its accomplishments since it was organized less than two years ago. It believes that the merchant and manufacturer, the retail dealer and the farmer will respond unambiguously to provide an adequate income whereby this development work can be carried on with the maximum of success.

More than 200 leading men throughout the state have endorsed the expansion movement of the State Chamber. They declare it to be the logical medium to take the initiative in working for the state as a whole. Its program of activities includes agricultural development, land settlement, the building of good roads, railroad extension, irrigation, industrial expansion and an advertising campaign for Oregon.

The Leader heartily endorses the movement of the State Chamber, because it believes in the State Chamber. It is hoped that Lincoln County, and particularly Toledo, will do its share to make the movement a success.
