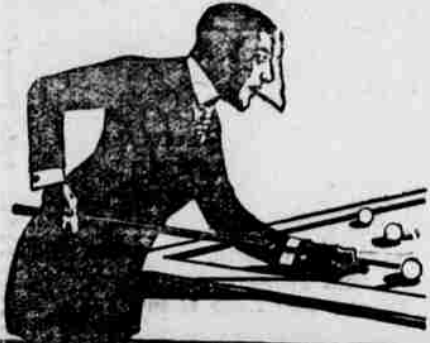

NEWS OF 38 YEARS AGO

We are in receipt of a copy of the Yaquina Post of Saturday, October 14th, 1882, published by Coll Van Cleve, same being sent to us by Mrs. Moses Gregson, of Philomath. The subscription price was then \$2.50 per year, and the paper is not as large as the rural papers of today. Following are some items gleaned from its columns:

The steam launch Mary Hall makes daily trips from Newport to Elk City, where it connects with the mail coach. Fare \$1.00 round trip. R. A. Bensell captain.

Mr. E. S. Altree has leased the City Hotel and moved up to his farm near Toledo on Tuesday. He will probably remain there until spring.

There are sixteen men at work at the quarry under the supervision of Joe Dougherty.

Alex T. McLaughry is making proof on his homestead. He names as witnesses: Moses Hurd, Geo. Matson, William Logan and M. Gillett, all of Newport, Benton County, Oregon. Proof being made before L. T. Barin, Register, at Yaquina, Or.

Work on the tunnels is progressing nicely. The summit tunnel at this end is being pushed night and day by three shifts of men. Work at number two and three is progressing steadily and satisfactorily fair progress being made each day. We are inclined to think from present indications that the tunnels will be no obstruction of the railroad through the mountains next season.

Among those carrying advertisements in the issue are: J. D. Graham, Dr. W. H. H. Rich, C. J. Bishop & Co., at Toledo; Newport advertisers are: P. M. Abbey, J. R. K. Irvin, Alonzo Case, Brasfield & Bayley and W. H. Hufford. M. M. Davis ran a drug store at Yaquina. A. Parker & Sons operated a sawmill at Onestata, and E. S. Altree the City Hotel at Yaquina.

A terrible storm had just visited the bay, to which the issue devoted more than a column of space, part of which we reproduce here.

"It was a wild, black night. A great funeral-curtain hung between the earth and sky, excluding every gleam of light, making the night as dark as ink. It was a roaring old night, and many people passed a sleepless night, kept awake by—well, the awful racket.

"When the storm was at its highest, Mrs. Moses Gregson, whose residence is built upon one of the pinnacles back of Yaquina, fully exposed to every zephyr no matter from what point of the compass it may spring from, accompanied by her little daughter and one of E. S. Altree's little boys, who was staying for company in the absence of Mr. Gregson, came down the steep mountain, over a narrow, winding trail, at the hazard of meeting an awful death by being blown from the narrow trail into the black, unfathomable depths below, to pass the remainder of the night at the City Hotel, because the winds raged with such terrible force about her dwelling that she feared every moment that it would be lifted in the arms of the mighty storm and hurled down the mountain's side.

"At the railroad docks the storm made everything quiver again. One of the large doors of the warehouse was unshipped and blown clear across the building. The pile-driver, fastened to a pile in the rear of the docks, was sunk. The pile broke during the night by the great strain brought against it, and as the tide rose the pile-driver was forced directly across or over the broken pile; as the tide receded the boat rested upon the jagged end of the pile, which forced its way through the boat, making a huge hole, which, in turn, let in the water, causing the boat to sink. It took a good part of the next day to raise the boat.

At Onestata the force of the wind was so great that the shop belonging to Fred Bailey, standing on the dock in front of Henkle, McCoy & Co.'s store, was blown over. "Stormy" Jordan was in the building, we believe, when it blew over, but received no serious bodily injury. Fred saved all his tools and stock—damage slight.

"Messrs. Rankin and Elder occupied a tent near the railroad docks. They were occupied a good part of the night in holding their tent down, as it seemed to have a dod-gasted desire to sail away, and in keeping themselves from drowning."
