PAPER PRICES STILL GOING UP

Before the war we used to pay \$60 per ton for our print paper. At the end of the war we were paying \$120 per ton for same. Last January, when we raised our subscription and advertising rates, we were paying at the rate of \$150 per ton. Since that date it has raised and raised and raised, until today we are paying \$270 per ton for our print paper, and the paper wholesalers say the peak has not been reached yet.

Some people seem to think, just because we raised our rates, that we are profiteering, but we can't just see how they figure it. In fact it is going to take some close figuring on our part to keep from the necessity of raising them again.

THE GREAT HOME INDUSTRY

All over the west fruit and vegetable canneries are busy all summer and fall—using up soil products and employing labor.

The local canneries are the great home industry—making a home market for what the farmers raise and a home market for labor.

The family labor of every community is mobilized in the field and in the packing plant of the canneries at good wages.

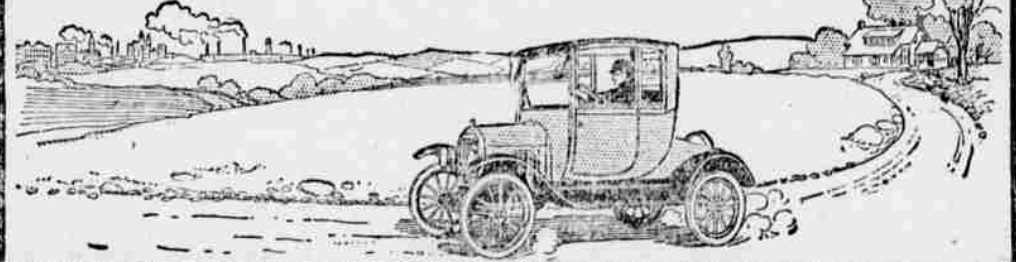
