

Another Royal Suggestion COOKIES and DROP CAKES From the NEW ROYAL COOK BOOK

WHEN the children romp in hunger, here are some wholesome delights that will satisfy the most ravenous appetite.

Cookies
1/2 cup shortening
1 cup sugar
1 cup milk
1 egg
1/2 teaspoon grated nutmeg
1 teaspoon vanilla extract
or grated rind of 1 lemon
4 cups flour
3 teaspoons Royal Baking Powder
Cream shortening and sugar together; add milk to beaten eggs and beat again; add slowly to creamed shortening and sugar; add nutmeg and flavoring; add 2 cups flour sifted with baking powder; add enough more flour to make stiff dough. Roll out very thin on floured board; cut with cookie cutter, sprinkle with sugar, or put a raisin or a piece of English walnut in the center of each. Bake about 12 minutes in hot oven.

Cocoa Drop Cakes
4 tablespoons shortening
1 cup sugar
1 egg
1/2 cup milk
1/2 cup flour
3 teaspoons Royal Baking Powder
1/2 cup cocoa
1/2 teaspoon salt
1 teaspoon vanilla
Cream shortening, add sugar and well-beaten egg; beat well and add milk; slowly add flour, baking powder, salt and cocoa into mixture; stir until smooth; add vanilla. Put one tablespoon of batter into each greased muffin tin and bake in moderate oven about 20 minutes. Cover with boiled icing.

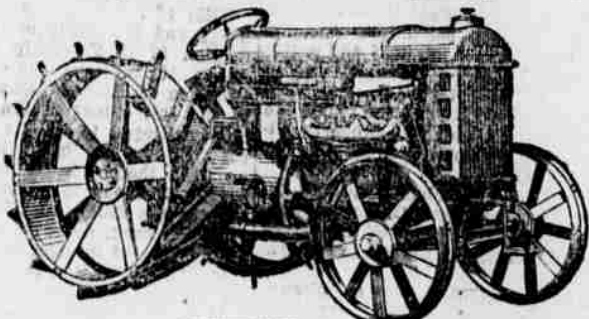
